

The test results are not a part of the school's grading system and will not appear on your child's report card. However, the WESTELL scores do become a part of each student's permanent record.

## **INFORMATIONAL SHEET WESTELL: DESCRIPTION OF TESTS**

The WESTELL is the English Language Development Assessment (ELDA) that West Virginia uses to measure the growth of limited English proficient (LEP) students' English proficiency. It measures growth of K-12 students in the domains of:

- Listening, speaking, reading, writing, comprehension

In addition, it also yields a composite score that represents the overall level of the student. The WESTELL (ELDA) has five levels of proficiency:

- Level 1 – Pre-functional
- Level 2 – Beginner
- Level 3 – Intermediate
- Level 4 – Advanced
- Level 5 – Fully English Proficient

This assessment helps determine students' English language development and better prepare them to function in mainstream content classrooms.

WESTELL (ELDA) is a test of English proficiency, not of academic content.

Therefore, there are no content area or prior knowledge requirements to score well on WESTELL (ELDA).
